There are several ways to assess writing. Items on the rubric range from state-mandated writing standards to individual items specific to an assignment. It's often helpful to provide students with a basic checklist to use as they review their work. Rinse and repeat! During the year, I will teach informational, opinion, and narrative writing. But we also have to share information with other people—like parents and administrators. When I teach a unit, there are a number of different skills that I teach. This student checklist is based on the 6-Trait writing. Once students have produced a writing sample for a prompt, I use the genre rubric from Step 2 to evaluate the writing. Step 2: I get my class checklist ready. As a district, we are committed to not making any changes. This blog post contains student writing samples that I used to assess students writing progress across the writing continuum. These samples were collected during our kindergarten writers workshop time. A teacher isn't the only one who can assess a writing sample. Sometimes, I use this unit-specific rubric twice during a longer unit: once in the middle, and once at the end. Sometimes, however, you might also need to produce letter or number grades. Print a copy of each genre rubric for each student in your class. ReadWriteThink offers a series of lessons that teach students how to peer edit using three steps: compliments, suggestions, and corrections. Is it a little bit subjective? Again, this is formative assessment. Make sure to keep the rubric s that you used to generate the grades so that you can provide in-depth explanations if necessary. You can do this with number grades too. Other forms of writing assessment use checklists or rating scales. I take that list of goals and turn it into a class checklist, like this: This checklist provides me with a place to make notes throughout the unit. Yes, but grading writing always is, to some degree! Step 4: Using a unit-specific rubric, I evaluate a writing sample that students have revised and edited on their own. The most common method is to use some sort of rubric. Related Topics.
